Typical Schedule:	Two weeks on days, two weeks on nights, one weekend
Course Objectives:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Evaluate trauma patients in the trauma bay and their treatment (both the trauma bay and operating room) • Discuss the pathophysiology of trauma patient and treatment options during rounds or a presentation • Demonstrate knowledge of FAST exam in a trauma patient
Course Description:	<p>Students will be expected to function at the level of a PGY-1 resident caring for patients with acute trauma. Students spend two weeks working during the day and two weeks at night. Students will work the Saturday and Sunday in between the day weeks. This means rounding on Saturday and Sunday with the Interns. Residents and faculty will supervise all student activities. The students' exposure will include patient encounters in the emergency room, trauma bay, and clinic. M4 students will also be expected to teach M3 medical students rotating through their surgical clerkships. Education material is presented through resident and attending rounds, didactic lectures, surgery conferences, morbidity/mortality conference and simulation training. M4 students are expected to give one presentation during the four-week period.</p> <p><u>Requirement Checklists</u></p> <p>This course has a requirement checklist in OASIS. Students are responsible for completing all required checklist procedures/encounters and assigning them to the appropriate team member for verification.</p> <p>Requirement Checklist Items include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Assist with a central line placement</i> • <i>Assist with a chest tube placement</i> • <i>Observe a PEG (scrubbed)</i> • <i>Perform two laceration repairs</i> • <i>Attend mid-rotation feedback session</i> • <i>Perform 20 H&P (2 each day/night)</i> • <i>Perform six FAST exams</i>
