Course Objectives:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Attend all operations and procedures assigned to the team, acting as intern to evaluate and help manage patients.</li> <li>2. Complete a new patient history and physical for an inpatient admission.</li> <li>3. Perform an exam under anesthesia on a patient with endometrial cancer and be able to discuss FIGO staging for endometrial carcinoma.</li> <li>4. Be able to describe the path of the ureter and how it relates to pelvic and para-aortic lymph node dissection.</li> <li>5. Understand the indications for total parental nutrition and be able to describe the composition of the solution and potential complications.</li> <li>6. Assist with the inpatient management of a patient after robotic surgery.</li> <li>7. Assist with the inpatient management of a patient after a laparotomy for gynecologic cancer.</li> <li>8. Be able to critically appraise the literature and develop an approach to the analysis of the various types of articles.</li> <li>9. Present a PowerPoint presentation on an article in the gynecologic oncology literature and be able to discuss the basis of hypothesis testing as well as how best to apply the findings of your analysis to clinical practice.</li> <li>10. Be able to discuss imaging modalities used in patients with gynecologic cancer.</li> </ol>
Course Description:	<p>This four week Acting Internship in Gynecologic Oncology is offered to students who have satisfactorily completed their third-year clinical rotations. Experience will be offered in an inpatient hospital-based setting under the direct supervision of resident and attending physicians. The student will perform the preoperative evaluation, attend surgery, and follow the patient postoperatively. Management will be discussed with the faculty at daily bedside teaching rounds. The students will present their patients and be expected to provide a discussion of management options. At the end of the four weeks, the student will be expected to present a peer-reviewed publication in journal club format to the department of Obstetrics and Gynecology. The publication is to be chosen in conjunction with the course director.</p>

**PATIENT CARE RESPONSIBILITIES (Inpatient Wards):** Students should attend daily work rounds with Oncology team. The Chief Resident will assign patients to the student to manage. Students should contribute to the care of their assigned patients by performing daily rounds, writing progress notes in the medical record, writing orders (if asked), and interpreting laboratory and imaging studies as directed by the supervising Residents and Faculty. **(Operating Room):** Students will have the opportunity to participate in the perioperative care of all patients undergoing surgery for gynecologic cancer and other pelvic conditions.
