| Course Description:        | <p>The student will be expected to function at the level of a PGY-1 resident caring for patients with acute surgical problems. Students spend two weeks working during the day and two weeks at night. Students will work the Saturday and Sunday in between the day weeks. This means rounding on Saturday and Sunday with the Interns. Residents and faculty will supervise all student activities. The students' exposure will include patient encounters on the surgical floors, emergency room, and clinic. M4 students will also be expected to teach M3 medical students rotating through their surgical clerkships. Education material is presented through resident and attending rounds, didactic lectures, surgery conferences, morbidity/mortality conference and simulation training. M4 students are expected to give one presentation during the four-week period.</p> <p><u>Requirement Checklists</u></p> <p>This course has a requirement checklist in OASIS. Students are responsible for completing all required checklist procedures/encounters and assigning them to the appropriate team member for verification.
