Typical Schedule:	Students will spend approximately half of their time inpatient and half of their time outpatient at a Center for Family Medicine (CFM) Residency Clinic and work 1 weekend day on the inpatient service.
Course Objectives:	<ol> <li>Perform at the level of a beginning first year family medicine resident.</li> <li>Perform, present, and document an admission History and Physical.</li> <li>Follow and have primary responsibility for the care of the patients they admit (from admission through discharge) or patients that are assigned to them.</li> <li>Work with the hospital healthcare team to transition the patient safely back to the outpatient setting.</li> <li>Demonstrate a working knowledge and understand key concepts of bread-and-butter inpatient Family Medicine cases and management.</li> <li>Formulate differential diagnosis and demonstrate the ability to order appropriate diagnostic studies and interpret their results</li> <li>Demonstrate a working knowledge of common outpatient medical problems and develop an understanding of the conditions requiring inpatient treatment.</li> <li>Formulate plans for acute, chronic, and ongoing conditions including nonpharmacologic and pharmacologic approaches, appropriate referral to specialists, and counseling.</li> <li>Demonstrate the ability to assess the psychosocial aspects of a patient's history and the effects they might have on the health of the patient.</li> <li>Ability to concisely communicate findings and plan to patient and to members of the care team both verbally and electronically through secure platforms (i.e. Epic, Doximity, Telmediq).</li> <li>Educate patients on disease prevention, health maintenance, and lifestyle modification</li> <li>Observe or perform under supervision procedures that are common to primary care (i.e. point of care tests, PAP smear, reading EKG, reading X-rays, joint injections, biopsy).</li> </ol>
Course Description:	This course offers a more intensive exposure to Family Medicine in our Prisma Health Academic Site at Center for Family Medicine – Greer. During this rotation students will be placed in a variety of clinical environments to best obtain a diversified experience. Students will spend 50% in the inpatient setting, which includes care of the acutely hospitalized patient and care of the newborn. The other

50% will be in the outpatient setting, which includes care for Pediatrics, Women's Health, Adults, and
Geriatrics. Clinical experience will also include management of acute and chronic illness, preventive,
and lifestyle medicine. Students will complete the AI requirements checklist and participate in
residency activities such as didactics, case presentation, and observe or perform primary care
procedures.
